




When asked how positive or negative spouses feel about Service Family Life:





Top 3 Negatives



Significantly less families feel negatively towards these areas of Service life compared to last year.

• Less spouses often start discussions about leaving the Service (2021=20%, 2020=25%), down 5% from last year.

The main reasons families don't own their own homes are:

57% say they can't afford to buy a suitable house

37% say living in Service accomodation suits their family's needs at the present time



Of the 34% families who live in SFA/SSFA, 69% feel that SFA is good value for money



The main difficulties spouses face when looking for a job are:

57% partner not being able to assist with care responsibilities

52% having a spouse who is often away

46% extended family living too far away to assist with childcare

80% of spouses are currently employed

1/2 of families with school aged children have needed childcare in the last 12 months

Families are **LEAST** satisfied with the cost of childcare facilities
